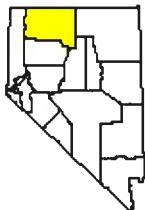


Humboldt County, NV in Profile



Humboldt County is one of 17 counties and county equivalent cities in Nevada. It has 9,647.9 sq. miles in land area and a population density of 1.7 per square mile. On the most recent census form, 97.2% of the population reported only one race, with 0.5% of these reporting African-American. The population of this county is 24.4% Hispanic (of any race). The average household size is 2.60 persons compared to an average family size of 3.10 persons.

In 2010 mining was the largest of 20 major sectors. It had an average wage per job of \$83,737. Per capita income grew by 5.0% between 1999 and 2009 (adjusted for inflation).

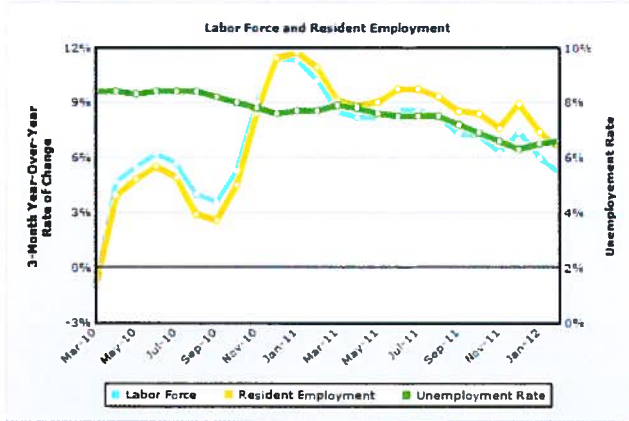

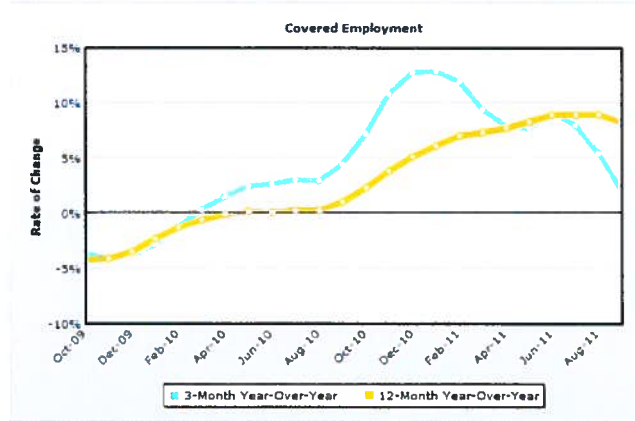

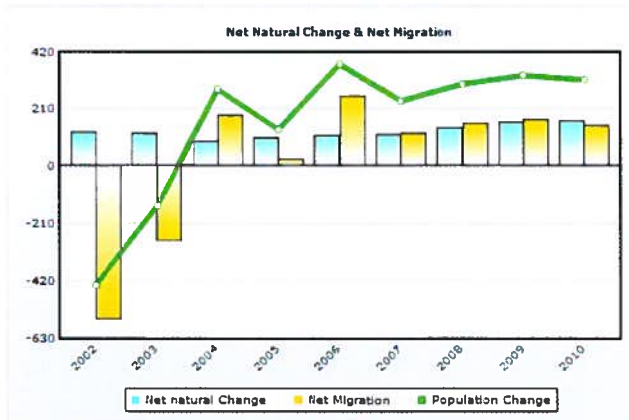

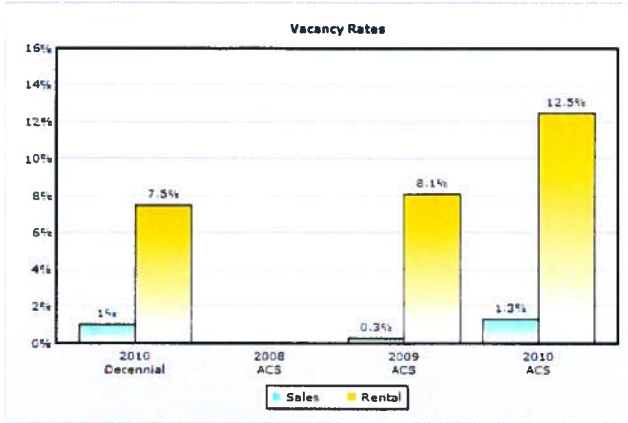

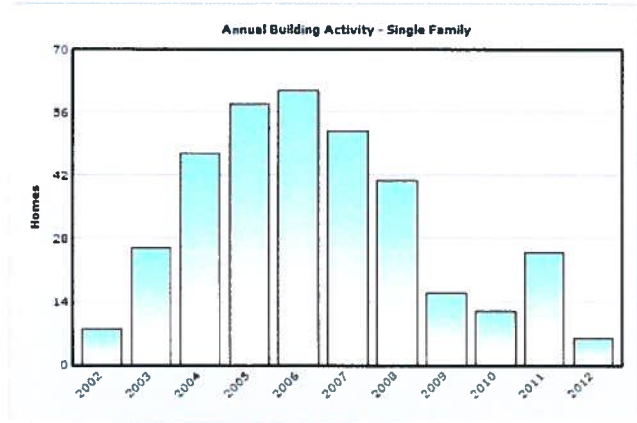

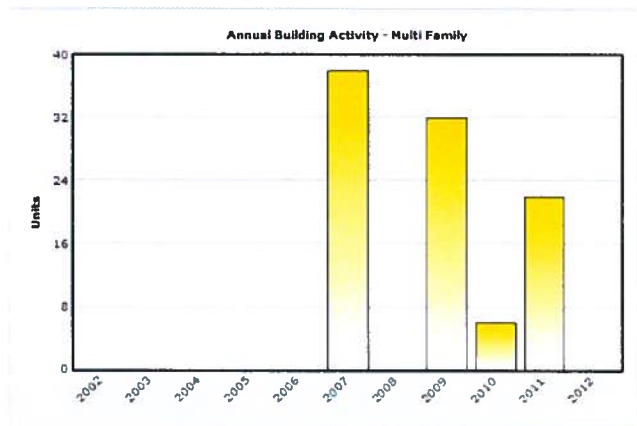

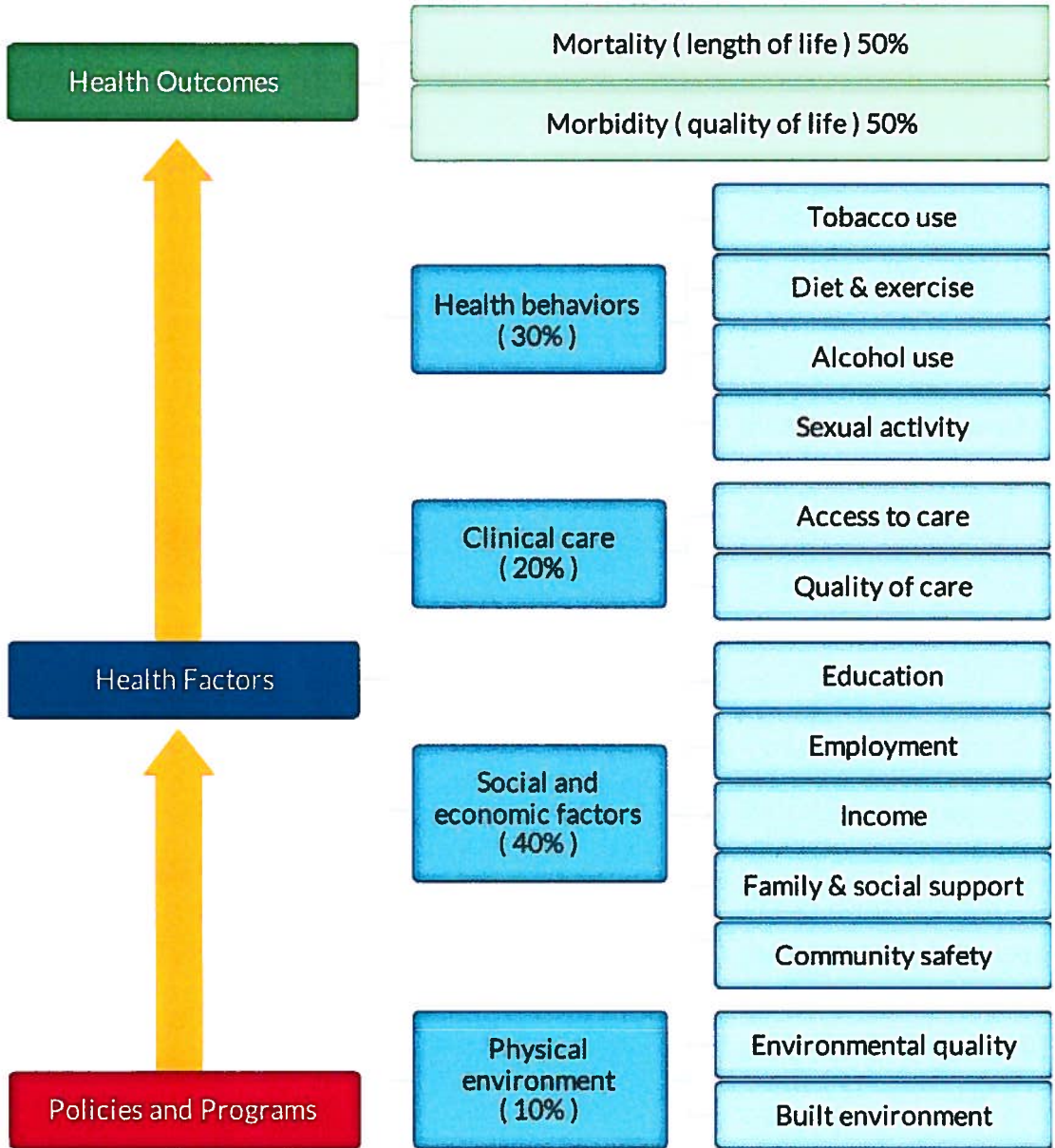

County Health Rankings

The 2012 *County Health Rankings* report ranks Nevada counties according to their summary measures of **health outcomes** and **health factors**. Counties also receive a rank for mortality, morbidity, health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and the physical environment. The figure below depicts the structure of the *Rankings* model; those having high ranks (e.g., 1 or 2) are estimated to be the “healthiest.”

Our summary **health outcomes** rankings are based on an equal weighting of mortality and morbidity measures. The summary **health factors** rankings are based on weighted scores of four types of factors: behavioral, clinical, social and economic, and environmental. The weights for the factors (shown in parentheses in the figure) are based upon a review of the literature and expert input, but represent just one way of combining these factors.

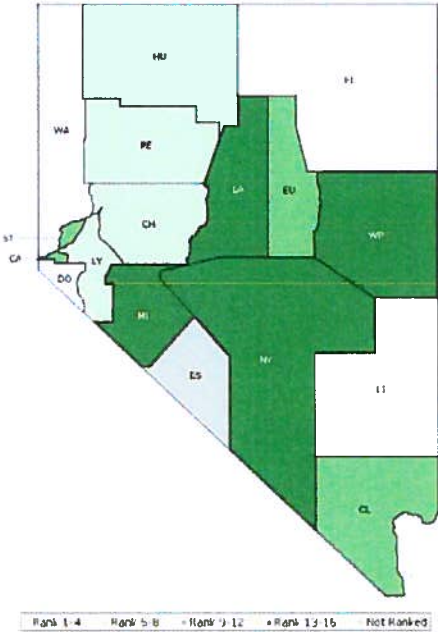

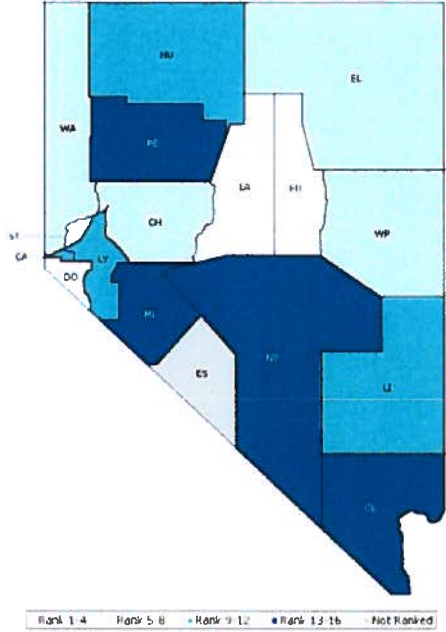
performance in the respective summary rankings. The green map shows the distribution of summary health outcomes. The blue displays the distribution of the summary rank for health factors.
