

Step 3: After you visit

For each program, look over the items that you marked with a ✓ to see the good points. Also, read the items that you left blank to see what is not in the program.

- look at what the program has to offer
- see what is missing
- think about fees, location, and hours open
- decide what is best for you and your baby

If you are not happy with any of the programs that you visited, then you may want to try another program. Trust your own judgment and feeling about a program. You know your baby best and can tell which program will be right for your family.
