Total Expenses subtracted from Total Income equals Project Income.

If total income is less than total expenses, you may have lost money on your project and need to find a reason and make necessary changes if you are keeping the cavy project as a business. Not all projects make money. Sometimes you must consider that a pet cavy, as used in the Showmanship Contest, is a cost item and the pleasure and experience of having the cavy is well worth the expense.

A WORD OF EXPLANATION

Records are kept so that you will have a better idea of where the money comes from and how it is spent. Your good animals will appear on the record sheet because of their value as breeders. Cavies that have poor records can be spotted and sold.

Use the expense and income columns to list all purchases made or sold. Record the items on the date you bought or sold. When items are used at home, assign a fair market value for record purposes. A fair market value is what one would have to pay a competitor or a store to buy that product. Be fair and sensible; don't try to pad your records. Include fair premiums as an income.
